Spring is the season of blooming! We have released and presented the alpha version of the Lykke Exchange and Lykke Wallet in the MoneyMuseum of Zurich on April, 1. The first users have started private testing of the wallet. We are gradually increasing the testing circle – we will send out invites in May.

International News

Ethereum is challenging Bitcoin. The news of the first platform production release and the announcement of the endorsement of Microsoft has fueled the price rise of Ether during the past three months. Today, Ether has a market capitalization of 720 Mio USD compared to 6.6 billion USD for Bitcoin.

Ethereum is a strong contender to unseat Bitcoin as the blockchain with the biggest capitalization. It is a lot easier to build applications on top of Ethereum than on Bitcoin Blockchain, so this will pave the way for broad adoption. It is still early days and a critical juncture for Ethereum; the high capitalization makes Ethereum an attractive target for hackers during the next few months. If Ethereum withstands this threat, the sky will be the limit. At our event in Zurich we have promised to add Ethereum as a supported blockchain as a part of our roadmap for 2016.

In the first week of April R3 has released the first version of its blockchain – Corda. Corda is designed from scratch to record, manage and synchronize financial agreements between financial institutions and has no native cryptocurrency.

Corda's key features, which distinguish it from the public blockchains such as Ethereum and Bitcoin, are the following:

- no unnecessary global sharing of data: only those parties with a legitimate need to know can see the data within an agreement

- consensus between firms is achieved at the level of individual deals, not at the level of the system: transactions are validated by parties of the transaction rather than a broader pool of unrelated validators
- regulatory and supervisory observer nodes are introduced
- explicit link between human-language legal prose documents and smart contract code

Corda will be open sourced when the code matures, and several prototypes are being built on top of it now.

One of the Corda-based prototypes was demonstrated this Monday by Barclays. The prototype was the result of a collaboration between Barclays, R3, the University College London, standards organization ISDA, French banking group Société Générale and TechStars, Barclays' partner on its FinTech accelerator. An investment banking application "Smart Contract Templates" demoed the lifecycle of an interest rate swap. A key feature of Corda on display showcased how not all nodes shared the information on the ledger. This design mechanism has been pointed to as an efficiency for financial institutions when compared to public blockchains.

Corda documents the versatility of the new blockchain technology; the big challenge is, however, to reduce complexity without diminishing diversity.

Prior to the seminar we presented the alpha version of Lykke Wallet and Lykke Exchange and the future releases roadmap. The alpha version is up and running. The first users have started testing the wallet. We are gradually increasing the testing circle.

The major features that are planned in the roadmap are:

- margin trading,
- offchain settlement,
- Ethereum support,
- money market with second-by-second interest rates,
- professional trading terminal,
- algorithms marketplace (Algo Store).

The event was a unique opportunity for the Lykke team to meet. 12 team members from 4 countries took part in the first Lykke Wallet presentation, the seminar and a get-together party afterwards. 10 of them then spent the weekend in Zurich discussing the Lykke strategy, product development, community building and current projects. The next meetup might take place in London. Lykke has just set up a subsidiary in the United Kingdom – Lykke Corp UK. The UK is a big hub for the growing FinTech sector, so London was a clear choice for Lykke’s international expansion. We plan to apply for the FCA license and expect to start operations in the UK by the end of this year.
